About 80 kg of plastic waste was collected and disposed in a proper way.


A certificate was also received from sarpanch SHANGUS and BRARIANANG for the sincere efforts put in to practice by the energetic volunteers.











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
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
# Report of one day seminar on "Drug De-addiction in the light of Quran and Hadith"

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### Report of One-Day Community Engagement Program at Poshnari - an adopted village

Date: 31st March 2022

Village adopted: Poshnari (District - Anantnag)

Targets: Village Poshnari and Govt Middle School Poshnari (Zone - Shangus)

#### Emphasis on:

- Community engagement: Awareness on sanitation and hygiene
- POSHAN Abhiyan Awareness on the importance of balanced nutrition for lactating mathers and children

#### Initial report:

A total of around 50 volunteers participated in the program. We left the college at 11 am and reached the target village at 12 PM. Early in the morning, the volunteers prepared food-packets to be distributed to the children in the adopted village.

On reaching the spot, the volunteers led by NSS Program Officers, Mrs Shawana Manzoor and Mr Mohmad Aarif Khanday, interacted with the community members to get inputs on varied socioeconomic issues faced by the community.

Later on, the volunteers interacted with the students of the school. Students briefed our volunteers about the issues they face in the school.

The lactating mothers of the area were provided POSHAN food kits that included among other food items – Brown bread, boiled eggs, butter packets, biscuits, bananas, etc.

#### Important observations:

The NSS Program officers/volunteers, after interacting with the community, made the following observations:

- A. Village level:
- 1. The village is situated some 5 kms away from the Block office, Chittergul.

- Facilities of drinking water and electricity are available.
- 3. The area has dense plantation cover.
- 4. The village has been declared as Open Defecation Free (ODF).
- 5. The knowledge about Government schemes/ flagship programmes is lagging.
- 6. Literacy rate is roughly down.
- 7. The people aren't as health conscious as they ought to be in this era.
- 8. Awareness about the sanitation is lagging.
- Due to poverty, the children are malnourished.
- 10. The major population depends on agriculture for its livelihood.
- 1. The school is housed in a single building with insufficient classroom space and dearth of student
- The school building isn't fenced.
- 3. Equipment for digital literacy like Desktops, laptops and smart boards are missing.
- Playground for the students isn't available.

### Recommendations:

Community development:- For the socio-economic development of the village, following recommendations are to be put under the notice of the District Administration for perusal and action.

- 1. Mass awareness programs on health, hygiene and sanitation need to be organized
- 2. The children need to be covered under POSHAN Abhiyan and similar flagship programs of the government
- 3. More awareness needs to be spread vis-à-vis Government's flagship programs for the welfare of the community
- 4. Awareness camps regarding the importance of education and literacy need to organized and the community needs to be engaged in whatsoever ways

School:- The school authorities have toiled a lot to bring the school close to the best schools in the zone despite the fact that the population there is primarily tribal. The students, though belonging to the poor families, are well trained. However, following recommendations are to be put under the notice of the concerned authorities to improve the overall condition of the school:

- 1. Only five staff members are present to look after a school with 8 levels/ classes. More staff should be deployed
- 2. The students should be given chance to express their skills and talent at a bigger platform
- 3. A few desktops/ laptop computers should be sanctioned to be used by the school children

- The school building should be fenced as there is possibility of man-animal conflict as the area is
- A playground needs to be developed for the students and some land needs to be acquired for the same.
