Sir/Madam

As per guidelines received from Chief Electoral officer J&K, available on Web "www.eci.nic.in" Electoral Literacy Clubs (ELCs) are to be set up in the country to promote electoral literacy in all age groups (particularly in the age group of 18 to 21 years old pursuing their graduation) of the citizens through engaging and interacting activities and hands-on experience, but in an apolitical, natural and non-partisan manner.

One or two teachers from Political Science department of the college shall act as a nodal officer for ELC. The campus administrators shall as the conveners of the ELC and will assist the Nodal officers in discharging of their functions. The main objectives of the ELCs are as under:-

1. To educate the targeted population about voter registration, electoral process and related matters through hands on experience.
2. To facilitate EVM and VVPTR familiarization and education about the robustness of EVM as well as the integrity of electoral process using EVMs.
3. To help the targeted audience understand the value of their vote and exercise their suffrage right in confident, comfortable and ethical manner.
4. To harness the potential of ELC members for carrying the electoral literacy in communities.
5. To facilitate voter registration for this eligible members who are not yet registered
6. To develop a culture of electoral participation and maximize the informed and ethical voting and follow the principal "every vote counts" and "voter to be left behind".

The details of activities to be undertaken by the respective colleges are given in the guidelines. You are as such requested to go through the guidelines and coordinate with field staff of Election Commission for proper implementation of the scheme.

**Report on**  
**Systematic Voters Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP) Campaign**

**Date: 19-03-2019**

In view of the formal directions propounded by Higher Education Department, J&K Govt. vide letter No: HE/Plan/449/2019 Dated: 12-03-2019, regarding constituting of Electoral Literacy Clubs (ELC) and disseminating wholesome awareness among the student community of the college regarding Electoral Process in India under a special election campaign viz; Systematic Voters Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP) launched by Election Commission of India (ECI), the following action has been taken by the NSS Programme Officers of the college:-

1. An Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) namely, **VOTER-INFO** was constituted with member strength of 30 students under the mentorship of Mr. Javaid Ahmad Kumar (Assistant Professor, Political Science) (List annexed)
2. An awareness and training oriented lecture was delivered by Mr. Firdose Ahmad Mir (Assistant Professor, Environmental Science) 23<sup>rd</sup> of March, 2019. He deliberated upon electoral process in Indian scenario. He also threw light on the challenges of contemporary Indian electoral system.

Mr. Firdose Ahmad Mir also gave a live demonstration regarding the various procedures including manual/offline procedure by consulting concerned Booth Level Officer (BLO), Assistant Electoral Registration Officer (AERO), Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) and Online platforms (Voters Helpline Mobile App, NVSP Portal, Websites of ECI and State Electoral Officers etc.) through which new aspiring voters can register themselves with ECI. Hands on training were also provided to students regarding procedure of New Registration/Addition, Correction, Deletion and Transposition of voters in electoral rolls.

Furthermore the students were also acquainted with operation of electronic voting machine (EVM) during elections using relevant video documentaries.

3. On 23<sup>rd</sup> of March, Mr. Shaib Mohd. Hajam deliver a brief lecture on the value of ones vote in democratic countries like India, USA, UK, etc. He also highlighted the role played by different forces in the history to achieve the right to vote in the world and how India gave the right to vote to all its citizens neglecting the social, economic, cultural and religious differences. Speaking to the students, Prof. Javaid Ahmad Kumar (AP, Political Science) also gave a brief account of upcoming Indian Parliamentary Elections.
4. Furthermore a rally was also organized in which the students of the college participated. Students displayed placards with slogans regarding election awareness.
5. On 3<sup>rd</sup> of April, 2019 a quiz competition was held in which the members students of the Electoral Literacy Club participated. Theme of the quiz programme was electoral system of India in particular and other democratic countries in general.

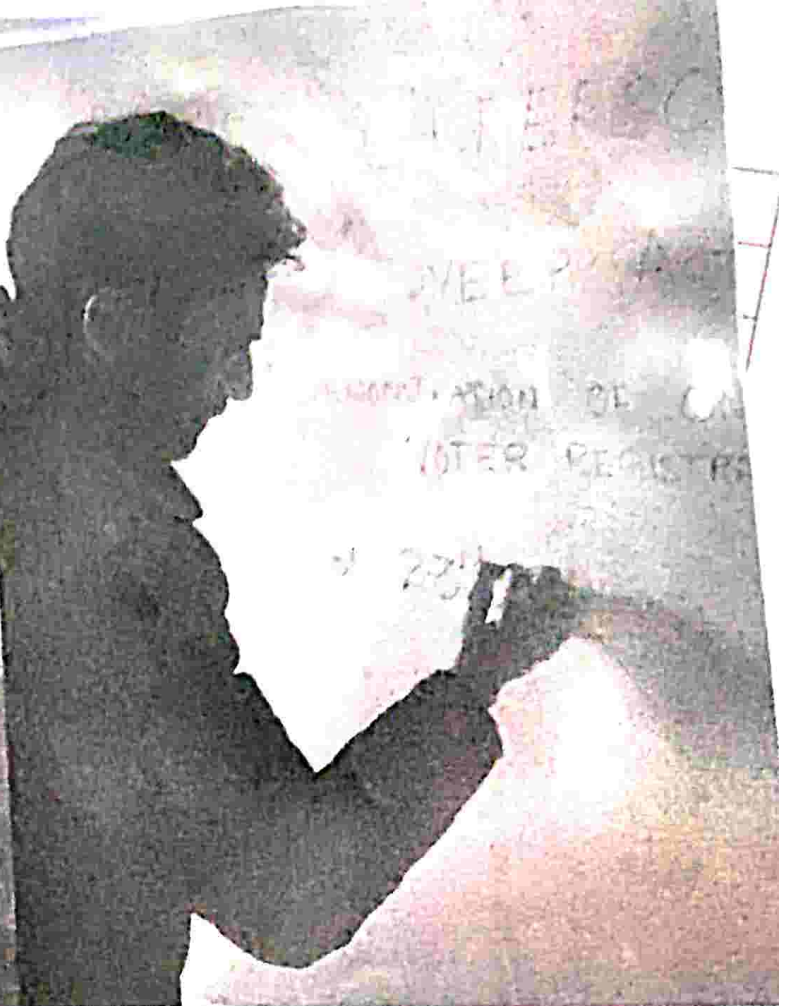

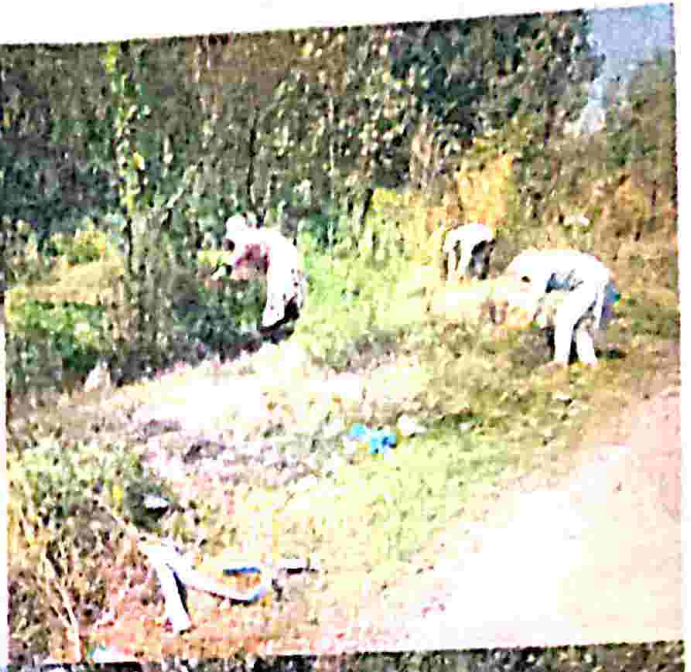

People living around the water body were also made aware about the consequences of the degradation and pollution of the water bodies in general and Shakarnag Spring in particular.






**14/07/2018:**

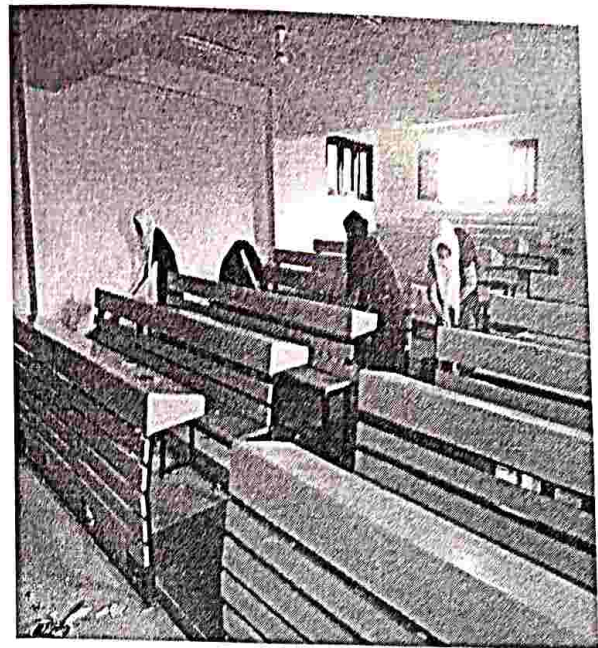

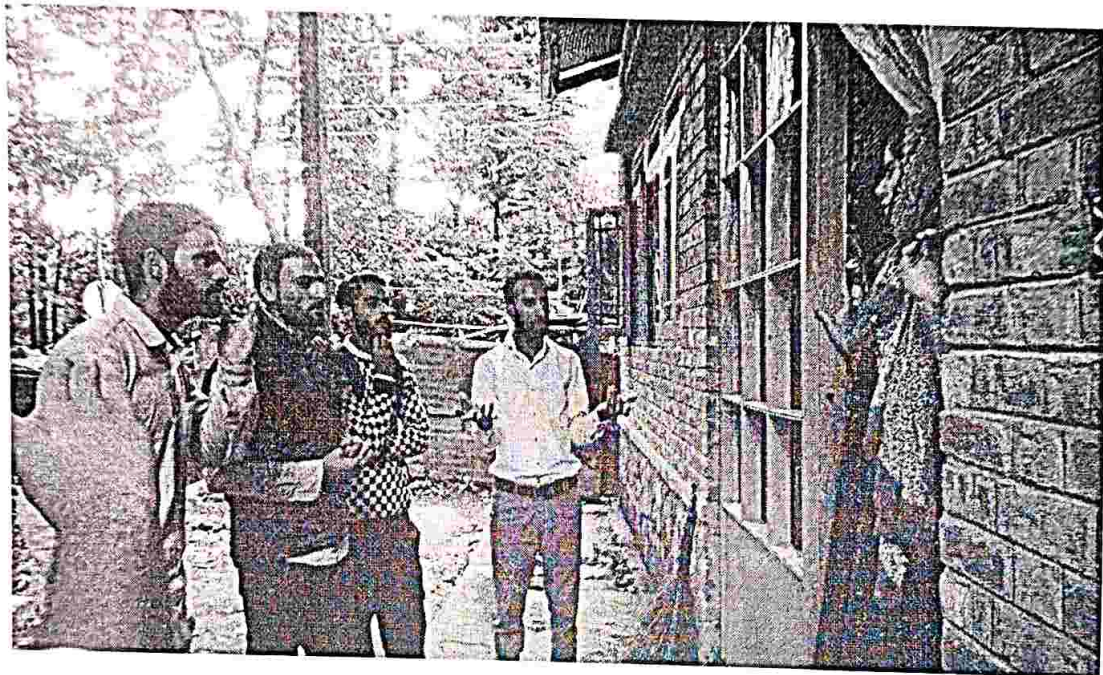
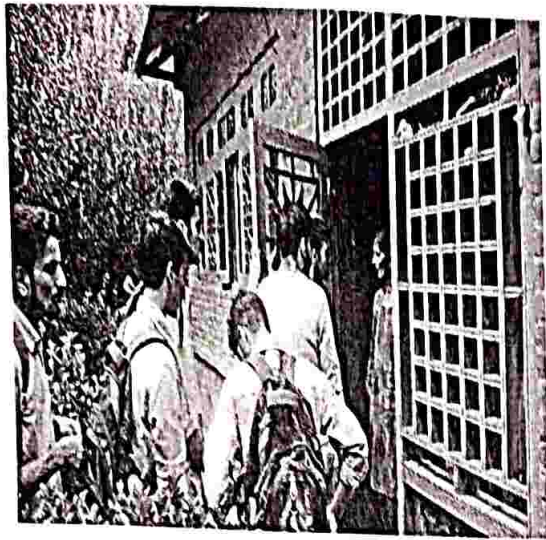

**OBSERVANCE OF SWACHHTA PAKHWADA BY THE  
NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) UNITS  
(01-15<sup>th</sup> August, 2018)**

**Background**

Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi urged the people of India to keep their surroundings clean during his first address to the nation on the eve of Independence Day. NSS have been conducting various activities under the cleanliness drive in the past.

To observe the Swachhta Pakhwara in befitting manner NSS organizations propose to conduct various activities during the observance of Swachhta Pakhwara. All the NSS Units will ensure due publicity of the activities/programmes to be conducted through all possible electronic and print media, so that the involvement of general public is also ensured in the celebration of this event. All the Regional Directorates of NSS will be entrusted with the responsibilities of providing guidelines to all the NSS units and also monitor the programme/activities during the conduct of the event. All the Regional Directorate will submit a brief report along with the action photographs and paper clippings after the culmination of the event. They will also ensure the necessary support of local authorities and other agencies as an when need arises during the conduct of various activities.

**Action Plan**

The following activities/programmes are proposed to be conducted by all the NSS Units across the country during the observance of Swachhta Pakhwara from 01<sup>st</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2018:

<b>1<sup>st</sup> August, 2018</b>	One day seminar on Swachhta will be organized by all the NSS Units in the country, where locally available eminent speakers will be invited to address the NSS Volunteers on the various issues of Swachhta. The event will end with the <b>Swachhta Shapath</b> (Oath) by all the <b>NSS Functionaries</b> including NSS Volunteers.
<b>2<sup>nd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2018</b>	All the NSS Units will devote Four days for cleaning their respective campus of their institutions. They will ensure that they clean each and every part of their campus like classrooms, laboratories, libraries, toilets, auditoriums, playgrounds, lawns, roads etc.

<p><b>6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2018</b></p>	<p>During the period, the NSS Volunteers shall visit the adopted village/slum and take up door to door campaign to make the local masses aware about the importance of cleanliness in their surroundings. During the campaign the discussion will be focused on Open Defecation Free (ODF) village/slum. The villagers will be convinced to construct the toilets in their premises and also to make use of them. NSS Units will also be directed to procure informative material like leaflets, handouts from the local agencies working in the similar fields, for further distribution to the people while visiting door to door in the adopted areas.</p>
<p><b>9<sup>th</sup> - 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2018</b></p>	<p>All the NSS Units will devote Two days for intensive cleaning of the adopted villages/slums. Efforts will be made to involve local people so that they understand the dignity of labour and develop a habit of keeping their surroundings clean.</p>
<p><b>11<sup>th</sup> - 13<sup>th</sup> August, 2018</b></p>	<p>All the NSS Units will identify locally based 1-2 welfare agencies like hospitals, dispensaries, community centers, old age homes, orphanages, center for disabled, rehabilitation centre, railway station, bus stations/stops etc., and dedicate their services for cleaning the area of the agencies and also to take up various welfare activities in the agencies. Special drives may be taken to clean statues &amp; Archeological sites and tourist Places.</p>
<p><b>14<sup>th</sup> August, 2018</b></p>	<p>All the NSS Units will organize rallies in their respective cities/villages by depicting various messages of cleanliness on banners and placards to create awareness in the masses.</p>
<p><b>15<sup>th</sup> August, 2018</b></p>	<p>All the NSS Units will hold a meeting of NSS Volunteers in their campuses under the Chairmanship of the Head of Institution and will discuss the future plans of sustaining cleanliness in the area. Head of the institution may declare the institution as <b>“Clean Institution”</b></p>

## **A Report on Observance of Swachhita Pakhwada**

**(1<sup>st</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> August, 2018)**

### **At Govt. Degree College Uttersoo**

In compliance to the directions from Regional Directorate National Service Scheme (NSS), Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India, Swachhita Pakhwada Programme under the Tagship scheme of the central Government, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (SBA) or Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) was organized by NSS units of Govt. Degree College Uttersoo, with effect from 01<sup>st</sup> August 2018 for a period of fifteen days to achieve the basic aims of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (SBA). The fifteen day programme was formally rolled out by the Worth Principal, GDC Uttersoo, Dr. A. M. Wani. 1.) The overall programme was rolled out by worthy Principal of the college Dr. A M Wani.

He acquainted the NSS volunteers about the overall programme. Further, NSS volunteers and other students took oath (Swachhta Shapath) to maintain the cleanliness of their indoor and outdoor environments.

2.) The NSS volunteers along with other students of the College were involved in the cleaning of the interiors of College building; classrooms, laboratories, library, toilets, and outdoor campus of the College including playgrounds, lawns, roads, etc. to inculcate in them the civic sense and make them socially conscious and responsible citizens of the society. Apart from the NSS volunteers, other students and faculty members also took part in the cleanliness activities.

3.) The NSS volunteers visited the nearby villages; Krad, Buchan and Bonard and conducted door to door community sensitization to make people aware about the adverse impacts of Open Defecation (OD) on environment in general and human health in particular. The volunteers along with other students and faculty members interacted with the common



masses and thereafter thoroughly surveyed these areas to identify the households lacking toilet facilities and later tried to persuade them not to defecate in open areas.

4.) The NSS volunteers took out the intensive cleaning of the Krad, Buchan and Bonard villages. The people of these villages were persuaded to keep their surroundings clean and to stop the problematic practice of littering. They were also asked to use separate dustbins for different types of wastes generated within the households and outside. NSS volunteers played a remarkable role by insisting the people of these areas to dispose-off the wastes at proper places in order to avoid the problem of nuisance foul smelling thereby creating hygienic environmental conditions.

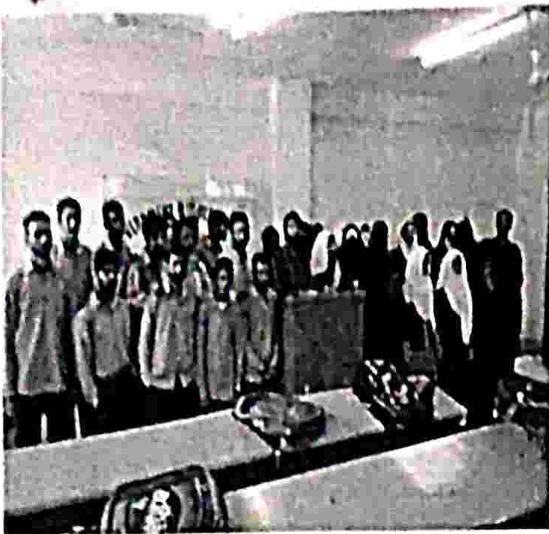

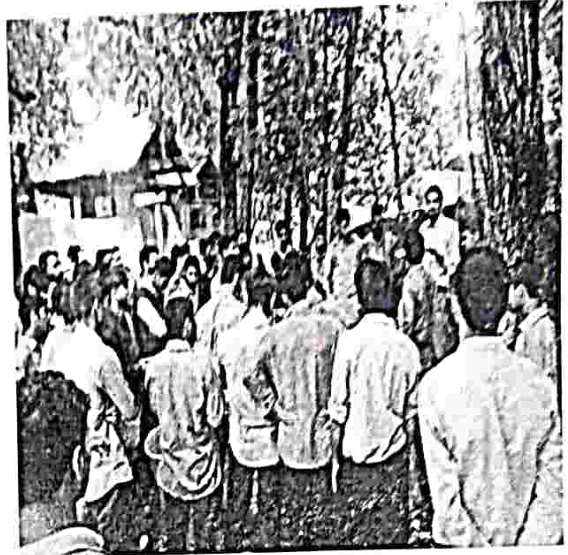
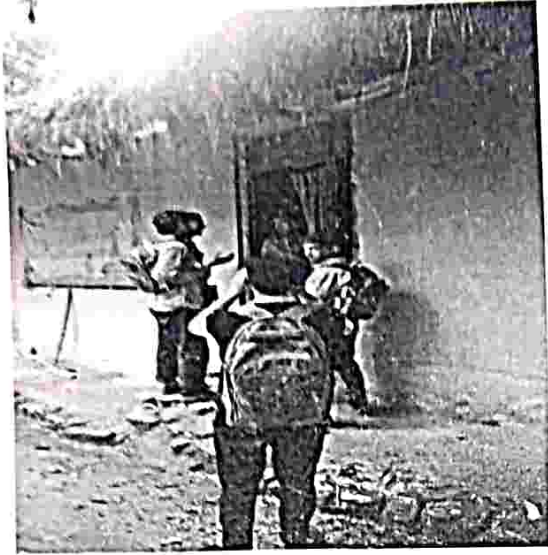
